

Invitation to Bid

The Boyd County Judge Executive will accept bids until 10:00 a.m. the 9th day of June, 2015 at the Boyd County Courthouse, Judge Executive's office, Catlettsburg, Kentucky, receive bids for the Fiscal Year 2015-2016. Bids will be received and accepted on the basis of the following requirements.

ASPHALT BIDS

1. All bidders must be Pre-Qualified with the Commonwealth of Kentucky's Transportation Cabinet and the aggregate amount of eligibility shall exceed \$500,000.00. The contractor shall be Pre-Qualified to perform both Asphalt Paving Option A and Option B types of work. A current copy of the bidders' Certificate of Eligibility must be included with their bid.
2. All bids must include a bid bond or certificate check in the amount of not less than 5% of their total bid. Upon award of this contract, the contractor shall furnish payment and performance bonds equal to 100% of the contract amount to the fiscal court.
3. Contractors shall carry the necessary insurance as required by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet. Certificates of Insurance will be required prior to starting work.
4. All materials and workmanship shall be accomplished with strict adherence to the current edition of the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet-Department of Highways' Standard Specification for Road and Bridge Construction.
5. All work will be subject to the direction, inspection and approval of the Boyd County Fiscal Court and their duly appointed representative.
6. Hot mix production plants and their plant labs shall be certified by the Commonwealth of Kentucky Transportation Cabinet and approved for the production and testing of Super pave Asphalt paving mixes. Quality Assurance testing shall be performed in accordance with KY. DOT specifications with the test results provided daily to the Boyd County Fiscal Court.

7. Paving equipment shall conform to KYTC specifications. Asphalt Pavers shall additionally be capable of laying a width of 20 feet in order to eliminate centerline joints on smaller roadways. Asphalt Rollers shall be a minimum of 10 tons.
8. Payment for items of work performed shall be based upon load tickets of material delivered to the project site and collected by the owners designated representative on the project.

OTHER BIDS

1. The Court reserves the right to reject any and all bids and waive informalities and make awards in a manner deemed to be in the best interest of Boyd County.
2. Oil and anti freeze shall be priced by the gallon for bulk deliveries and or by the case for smaller quantities.
3. Fuel to be priced for the cost to deliver, sell and tax by the gallon over rack price. Cost of fuel will be priced by rack price on the day the fuel is ordered.
